#### The First Reading: Ephesians 1:11-19

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having  
been destined according to the purpose of him who  
accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will,  
so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ,  
might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also,  
when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your  
salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the  
seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our  
inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to  
the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love  
toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to  
give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I  
pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of  
glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as

## Sermon

## Point to Ponder

Ever wonder why the Verger or one of the Acolytes puts the big chalice looking lid covered thingy and the little jug with wine in the box with the cross on left side behind the altar? Let's start with the big chalice looking lid covered thingy. It is called a ciborium. It is a holy (or specially blessed and designated) vessel used to hold consecrated host in reserve. The little jug with wine is called a cruet. During our Eucharistic prayer, we call upon God to send the Holy Spirit to sanctify the gifts of the host (or bread) and wine so they become Christ body and blood. We sanctify/consecrate the host and wine so we can live out the Gospel according John 6:53-56 that reads: "Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my

blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them.'" Once by the grace of God the bread and wine are consecrated we handle them with special reverent care. That is why whatever is not consumed by the people during the distribution is placed by the priests in the ciborium or remains in the cruet. Since the consecrated host and wine are now valuable items, the ciborium and the cruet are placed in a container (the box with the cross on it behind the altar) where they can be safely stored. The big wooden box with the cross on it is called a tabernacle. The term comes from the ancient Hebrews. The tabernacle was the special location where God was with them as they traveled. Symbolically, our tabernacle reminds us that our Lord is present with us as we travel on our earthly pilgrimage. There is a candle or light lit whenever the holy food and drink are stored in the tabernacle letting us know that Christ is present in our holy space.
