The Thing You Missed

This is a simple message about simple things.

It is a difficult message about powerful, Godly things.

It's a brief message about the brief thing that you are missing.

I once had a sit-down, intimate dinner with a President and First Lady of our country. I left the dinner thinking how cool it was to see that he was just a man.

I recently had a sit-down conversation with a homeless, mentally-ill man. I left that conversation thinking how cool it was to see, in a real way, that he was God.

In case you have not noticed, God is not what we expect, and he is most often not doing the things we are trying to do. He is actually doing things despite of the thing we are doing. We are doing "big" things and he is doing "little" ones. This even applies to pastoring a church. I am trying to pastor and grow this church into further health and meaningful ministry and faith, but, in all that I do here, I am constantly reminded that what God is actually doing in our midst are things that I almost fail to even see. They are little. They are things that happen along the way to doing other important things.

In the first chapter of Acts, just before the resurrected Jesus ascends into heaven, the disciples are still asking him if he will soon restore their people to power over the Roman empire and rest of the world. They actually *still* believed *that* was what Jesus was doing in the world! They just missed it! And so do we.

We think God = big. We forget that, with God, up = down and big = little.

Don't of think this as mere cliché or you will miss it again!

What God is really doing in your day-to-day living is most often in the little things. It is in the kindness shown to you by a stranger. It is in your making time to slow down to listen and encourage a coworker. It is in sharing your pain with another, who will be immediately strengthened by knowing that they are not alone.

Think about it. If we are too busy to slow down for the little things, then, literally, we are too busy to be a Christian. And we are *certainly* too busy for the important things of God. For God cares about the little things of our lives, and he obviously cares for any person who we can easily consider as "little" — an employee under you, a mentally-ill neighbor, a person needing financial assistance, etc.

This is not easy. But the things you are missing are the greatest things of God, and they are probably the littlest things of your day.

Slow Down, God at Work.

UPCOMING THIS FALL SEASON

THIS FALL'S THEME:

Making It Real!

It is a <u>life-giving</u>, <u>guilt crushing</u>, <u>mistake avoiding</u> thing to integrate your *believing* with your *doing* (to make your faith real)! But how? At home? At work? Behind the wheel! How do you possibly navigate our crazy world so that you end up having lived the kind of life you believe you should live? For centuries Christians have found that what we need are personal *rules of life* that encompass your honest beliefs, strengths, and weaknesses.

Each Sunday of this fall, starting on August 18, we sincerely hope you will join us as we seek to make our faiths real – *Making It Real* – utilizing an ancient *rule of life* method. Our Sunday morning classes (and often sermons) each week will explore seven different important areas of life as we individually answer the question: *How do I need to live in this area of my life so that I can stay healthy, faithful, and blessed?* The method we are using is "The Way of Love: Practices for Jesus-Centered Life."

LENDING LIBRARY

A lending library is a library that allows someone to borrow something with the idea of returning the item.

Early church libraries were for the use of clergy and laymen. The books were largely in Latin and theological in character and remained in house.

Thomas Bray, an Anglican cleric, had the idea of the **parish library**; he wrote an essay entitled *An Essay Towards*Promoting all Necessary and Useful Knowledge, Both Divine and Human..., [he] wanted the church to acquire books; lending them out to clergy and parishioners. [He] promoted **circulation** of books so the parishioners could take them home.

Some contemporary churches, such as **Holy Cross**, maintain a **lending library** on theological and religious subjects as well as materials for the parishioner's reading enrichment and enjoyment.

Libraries promote a culture of learning and knowledge-sharing. Although libraries have changed significantly over the course of history, their cultural role has not. They are the place where a toddler can hear his/her first story and a scholar can carry out research.
