Point to Ponder

Ever heard of Allhallowstide? Probably not. It has slipped into the mists of history, yet we participate in Allhallowstide events. Allhallowstide is a holy triduum, or a three-day period, that is meant to focus our attention on the Saints and all the faithful departed to see how people have been the instruments of God's peace and served as the hands and feet of Christ. It starts with Halloween. Halloween culturally associated with the scary and trickery, but Halloween comes from the contraction of Hallow or Holy and Evening. Originally, it was a vigil where people went to the graves of loved ones, prayed, and placed lit candles on them to honor and remember their ancestors. Placing a candle on the grave symbolically showed that the light of their life still glowed, and it also showed how their ancestors lit the dark places in the lives of the living. They believed their deceased loved ones could visit this world on this special evening. It changed over time to a night where it was believed that all the spirits, including malevolent spirits were able to roam the earth and create havoc and mischief. People dressed up in disguises to fool the roaming spirits, and put out treats to appease them.

In modernity, people have party-ized Halloween by wearing costumes and having special events like 'trunk or treat.' Halloween is followed by All Saints Day - day we remember those who immersed themselves in Christ and dedicated their lives to sharing the gospel. These were the Saints with a capital "S" - people who were martyred, or were blessed with special gifts and performed miracles, or given holy intelligence used to form and shape our church. Most of what we have in the form of our liturgy and theology has it's genesis from these Saints. The third day of Allhallowstide is the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed. This day is set aside for us to take time to remember our loved ones who have died. Of the three days in the triduum, I think this is the most important day, because our loved ones, family members or others who were close to us, who have died were the ones who formed us. They made us who we are today. They were the voice of God and face of Christ for us. More than anything, how we view our faith, and the meaning of our rituals, is directly related to what our loved ones taught us. They are the saints with a small "s." Current practice for All Saints Day is to include the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed. I pray you see how Allhallowstide helps us remember the saints, and, prayerfully through this remembering, guides us to emulate their lives.
