**The Collect of the Day - prayed by the Celebrant**

**The First Reading: Joel 2:23-32**

O children of Zion, be glad  
and rejoice in the LORD your God;  
for he has given the early rain for your vindication,  
he has poured down for you abundant rain,  
the early and the later rain, as before.

The threshing floors shall be full of grain,  
the vats shall overflow with wine and oil.

I will repay you for the years  
that the swarming locust has eaten,  
the hopper, the destroyer, and the cutter,  
my great army, which I sent against you.

You shall eat in plenty and be satisfied,  
and praise the name of the LORD your God,  
who has dealt wondrously with you.

And my people shall never again be put to shame.

You shall know that I am in the midst of Israel,  
and that I, the LORD, am your God and there is no other.  
And my people shall never again  
be put to shame.

Then afterward  
I will pour out my spirit on all flesh;  
your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,  
your old men shall dream dreams,  
and your young men shall see visions.

Even on the male and female slaves,  
in those days, I will pour out my spirit.

I will show portents in the heavens and on the earth, blood  
and fire and columns of smoke. The sun shall be turned to  
darkness, and the moon to blood, before the great and terrible  
day of the LORD comes. Then everyone who calls on the  
name of the LORD shall be saved; for in Mount Zion and in  
Jerusalem there shall be those who escape, as the LORD has  
said, and among the survivors shall be those whom  
the LORD calls.

*Reader* The Word of the Lord.

*People* **Thanks be to God.**

**Psalm 65 :** (read responsively by whole verse)

- 1 Praise awaits you, O God, in Zion; to you our vows will be fulfilled.
- 2 O you who hear prayer, to you all men will come.
- 3 When we were overwhelmed by sins, you forgave our transgressions.
- 4 Blessed are those you choose and bring near to live in your courts! We are filled with the good things of your house, of your holy temple.
- 5 You answer us with awesome deeds of righteousness, O God our Savior, the hope of all the ends of the earth and of the farthest seas,
- 6 who formed the mountains by your power, having armed yourself with strength,
- 7 who stilled the roaring of the seas, the roaring of their waves, and the turmoil of the nations.
- 8 Those living far away fear your wonders; where morning dawns and evening fades you call forth songs of joy.

**Sequence Hymn 314:** "Humbly I Adore Thee"

**The Gospel Reading:** *Luke 18:9-14*

*Reader* The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

*People* **Glory to you Lord Christ.**

Jesus told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."

**The Nicene Creed** (p. 358 BCP)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.  
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father,  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God,  
begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.  
Through him all things were made.  
For us and for our salvation  
he came down from heaven:  
by the power of the Holy Spirit  
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,  
and was made man.  
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;  
he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again  
in accordance with the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son.  
With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.  
He has spoken through the Prophets.  
We believe in one holy catholic\* and apostolic Church.  
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.  
We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come. *Amen.*

(\*Fun Fact: "catholic" means universal)
