Even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. #### The Nicene Creed (p. 358 BCP)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,

## A Note on Lent

We begin Lent this week starting with Ash Wednesday where we remember our frailty and dependence on God. Lent has a scriptural basis as it mirrors the sacrificial time Jesus spent in the wilderness before beginning his ministry. It is a forty-day period where we prepare ourselves, our church, and our homes for the coming of our resurrected Lord. In the past, people did acts of penance and spring-cleaning during Lent. We don't do that as much now; (however, you can

paint a section of our education wing.) But we still take time to read scripture, pray, and meditate. We may also fast or give up a luxury during Lent, so that we, in a small way, feel a tinge of hunger and make a small sacrifice to give us a physical reminder of the hunger and sacrifice Jesus felt while spending 40 days in the wilderness. Reading, praying, meditating and fasting are Lenten ways we can deepen our relationship with our Lord.
